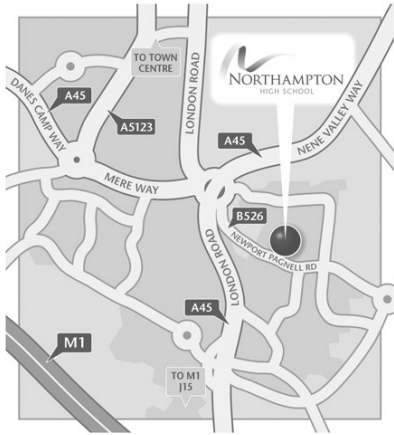


# MAP, INFORMATION & BOOKING FORM
