Living Faith modules are open to any Christian who would like to learn more about their faith. You need not have done any academic study before but you will need a reference from your church minister or a tutor who has taught you recently to say that you would benefit from study this level. The student group will include those training as Lay Pastoral Ministers, Licensed Evangelists and Readers in the Diocese of Peterborough, as well as members of other churches.

Everyone taking a *Living Faith* module will be encouraged to keep a learning journal that will include reflections on what you are learning, write ups of projects and assignments. These can be produced in a variety of forms—video diary, essay, letter, audio recording etc.
