



Toby Greany is Professor of Education at the University of Nottingham. His research is focused on how policy and practice interact to shape educational opportunities and outcomes, in particular across local systems and through networks, and the nature and role of leadership in these processes. His research includes studies funded by the Association of Education Committees, Economic and Social Research Council, Education Endowment Foundation, Nuffield Foundation, Wellcome Trust and UK Department for Education. He currently chairs the Greater Manchester Priority Area Partnership Board on behalf of the UK Department for Education. His most recent book – *Leading Educational Networks: Theory, Policy and Practice* (Bloomsbury, 2022) – was co-authored with Dr Annelies Kamp, University of Canterbury, Aotearoa New Zealand. He has advised the OECD, EU and ministries in several countries on issues relating to school leadership and educational system reform.



Dr Krish Kandiah OBE is the founder of The Sanctuary Foundation, a charity supporting refugees to find welcome, work and worthwhile housing in the UK. He is recognized as an expert in refugee resettlement, child welfare reform, educational innovation and civil society mobilization. Krish has led the charge on mobilizing civil society groups and churches as they have supported recent arrivals from Hong Kong, Afghanistan, Ukraine and Sudan. He is a regular adviser to government. He was appointed by the Secretary of State as the Chair of the Adoption and Special Guardianship Leadership Board (2019-2021) where he brought strategic leadership to the finding of permanent loving families in the care system. He has helped to inspire and train thousands to care for vulnerable adults and children.



Professor David Hopkins is currently Chair of Educational Leadership at the University of Bolton, as well as being Professor Emeritus at the Institute of Education, University College London and the University of Nottingham. David is passionately committed to improving the quality of education for all and has worked at the intersection of policy, research and practice for over forty years. Among a range of educational roles, he has been Chief Adviser to three Secretary of States on School Standards in the UK, Dean of Education at the University of Nottingham, a secondary school teacher, Outward Bound Instructor and consults internationally on school and system reform. David completed his school improvement trilogy with the publication of *Exploding the Myths of School Reform* in 2013; the previous books being *School Improvement for Real* (2001) and *Every School a Great School* (2007). He was recently ranked as the 16th most influential educator in the world by the American based Global Gurus organization. His latest book - *Unleashing Greatness* - was published in Spring 2024.
