- 1. Cut out your chatterbox and place text side down on a table.
- **2.** Fold the square in half, both ways to create creases. Then fold each corner into the middle. Flip it over and fold each corner into the middle again. Fold the square in half, both ways again. Leave folded.
- **3.** Put your thumb and forefinger in the square pockets to move the chatterbox.
- **4.** Find a partner and ask them to spell their name. For each letter, move the chatterbox back and forth.
- **5.** Ask them to pick an impossible choice to reflect on. When ready, lift the flap to find out more.
- 6. Repeat the process (there are four choices to explore).
