


What new things will we look at today?



Today we will be thinking about the importance of showing and sharing love in our daily lives.




Sometimes we might miss the messages of love that are all around us, every day ...

In the Bible, we are often reminded about the value of LOVE through images of shepherds with their sheep, showing love and care to their flock, every minute of every day.




Sometimes we might need an extra bit of love, when things are difficult ...

Everyone is part of the flock, everyone is welcomed back to the flock, everyone is loved ...



We all have a responsibility to show and share love, in our everyday lives - and at more difficult times. That way, we feel part of the flock – but we also know that we are valued as individuals.

Thank you that you teach us how to be a kind neighbour and friend.


Thank you that you encourage us to help one another and give us the love and kindness that makes this possible.



Share any inspirations from today's worship...
