New Training Terms & Conditions



The Partnership have introduced a new set of Terms and Conditions for learners signing up to take NSCP training. This has been introduced due to the high number of late cancellations and non attendees on some courses.

The full NSCP Training Terms and Conditions can be read here.

Key points are contained below:

- Delegates are able to cancel spaces on training themselves up to 72 hours before the start of a course;
- Courses reminders and joining instructions are circulated 2 weeks and 1 week prior to a course;
- Non attendance at a training course and late cancellations (less than 72 hours before) will
 result in a charge of £50 for organisations;
- Organisations will be invoiced quarterly for non attendance of learners at NSCP training.

Reducing Parental Conflict - Awareness Course

Conflict between parents is a normal part of relationships and family life. Not all conflict is damaging, but the way conflict manifests – its frequency, intensity and how it is resolved – can negatively affect children.

Target Audience

The training is aimed at front-line practitioners who have regular contact with parents as part of their day-to-day role with children and families.

Course Aims and Objectives

The training looks at some definitions for parental conflict and the evidence of the impact of parental conflict on children and associated outcomes. It looks at how discussions could be started with parents where parental conflict is recognized, and offers time to think about your involvement and how you can develop your practice in this area going forward

The training will be delivered via Teams, last 2.5 hours (including a break) and includes use of breakout rooms for discussion and shared learning.

Child Exploitation

Graded Care Profile 2

Northamptonshire has purchased for practitioners to use the Graded Care Profile 2 Neglect Assessment Tool in both North and West Northamptonshire. All practitioners who use the tool must be trained by qualified GCP2 trainers in Northamptonshire. No staff can use the GCP2 without being trained.

By attending this course you will:

- Become licensed to use the GCP2
- Consolidate your existing knowledge in relation to neglect
- Understand how GCP2 fits in with local practice

In the process the course will go through:

- What is neglect?
- What is its impact?

- Why is it difficult to assess?
- What the GCP2 is and how it can help you in your practice
- Allow you to get practical and hands on with the tool before using it in practice.

To become a qualified practitioner you must attend and complete the whole day course.

All practitioners who have face to face contact with families, any practitioners can complete a GCP2 Assessment including Social Workers, Family Support Workers, Teachers, Home School Link Workers, Health Visitors, Health Staff, Voluntary Sector, Child Care Workers and many many more.

The model is focused on building relationships and working together, identifying areas that need to change, including worries and risk, whilst focusing on strengths, resources and networks.

These briefings are to ensure all staff within the partnership are aware of the approach and the language, so you can start to use them in your day-to-day work and support our Signs of Safety journey.

Working with Disables Children & Safeguarding

Course Description

This course is for all workers in Northamptonshire Children's Trust and multi-agency staff and partner agencies who want to understand more about the needs of disabled children, impact on family members and issues that impact on safeguarding them.

Target Audience

Any member of staff within NCT and multi agency staff.

What you can expect to learn

- Identified the importance of seeing disabled children as 'children' first and seeking their views and wishes
- Gained an understanding how and why disabled children are vulnerable to abuse
- Explored the barriers to professionals acting on concerns
- Explored the barriers to communicating with children with disabilities techniques to overcome them
- Gained an understanding about attachment behaviours and explored how different attachment styles affect behaviour
- Explore what it means to live with a disabled child from a family's perspective
- Examined a recent safeguarding practice review identifying safeguarding concerns and reporting
- Signposted to available resources

E-Learning



The NSCP e-learning offer continues to be a popular way for organisations to train staff in a variety of safeguarding topics. NSCP E-Learning Guide

The partnership continues to offer 25 courses via e-learning these range from introductory and refresher courses on safeguarding to specific subject areas including CSE, FGM, Domestic Abuse and many more. You can view a full list of courses available here. All courses should take 1-2 hours to complete depending on how quickly you digest the information but can be taken in bitesize chunks

allowing you to save progress along the way and return at a later dates. Upon completion you will receive a certificate to show you have completed a course.

All E-Learning courses remain free to members of the children's workforce in Northamptonshire, more information including minimum system requirements and FAQs can be found on the NSCP website here.

Impact of Training



For us to monitor the effectiveness of our training, the Partnership needs to evidence the positive impact the training and events provided on the day-to-day practice of staff in Northamptonshire. Failure to evaluate the effectiveness of training may result in the offer being reduced in the future.

The majority of courses have a post course evaluation attached to them, these usually take less than 5 minutes to complete and we ask that you complete these immediately after completing an elearning course or attending one of our virtual events.

We will also be undertaking 3 month impact evaluations of our training courses again where you will be sent a short questionnaire to evaluate the impact the course has had and how you have put your learning into practice. Again, we would ask that you take the time to complete these questionnaires that will take no more than 5 minutes. We will also be asking for a number of practitioners to undertake a more in depth conversation about the impact courses have had on practice, if you would like to be part of this process please fill in your details on the form.
