Our offers for staff

Learning for Peace:
A curriculum for primary schools

Meeting many PSHE and SMSC needs, this curriculum develops the skills and attitudes of peace, using participative and fun activities to explore peace within, between and around us, as well as in the world beyond.

Training

 A day or half day INSET for staff introducing the curriculum and approach and modelling a circle of Learning for Peace with staff.

Support

- Planning how to fit the curriculum in your school life.
- Supporting staff to deliver the sessions with mentoring.

Restorative Practice

Restorative relational practice in schools is fundamentally about how we build, maintain and repair relationships. Seeing the classroom or school as a community in which individuals are connected and accountable to one another leads to a continuum of practices — from proactive to reactive.

Training

- One day introductory INSET on restorative approaches.
- One day skills development in delivering restorative approaches.

Support

- Mentoring for Senior Leadership, for Restorative leads in how to embody and embed restorative practice beyond the initial training.
- Support for restorative facilitation in more complex situations.

Young Peace Ambassadors

Imagine a team of pupils whose role is to promote peace around school. What difference might they make? What skills might they develop? What impact might they have on the wider school community? How might their presence act as a counter to the high levels of anxiety and concern about the world that we know exists amongst children today?

Training

- Day workshop for one year group on what is peace and how can it manifest in school.
- Follow up training for a small group of Peace Ambassadors to lead on the work.

How to sustain the scheme.

Peer mediation

Children are trained as mediators to help resolve conflicts on the playground. Adults are supported to make the scheme a success.

It has altered the way we deal with conflict in school. Children feel like they are being listened to. They are learning to solve their own problems too.

WORKING WITH A GROUP OF SCHOOLS
